

STOP is funded by the DC Department of Health HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, STD, and TB Administration (HAHSTA) and is administered by Housing Counseling Services, Inc (HCS).

HCS is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization founded in 1972 that provides comprehensive housing counseling, training, advocacy, technical assistance and housing opportunities for low- and moderate-income home buyers, homeowners, and tenants; to help them achieve successful living in healthy, safe, and affordable homes.

The goal of HCS is to prevent homelessness and increase sustainable housing opportunities by providing the skills, self-esteem and empowerment necessary within families and communities. Further, HCS works to build the individual and group capacity for economic, physical, and social development of homes, neighborhoods, and communities.

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Senior Transitional Opportunity Program

STOP is a community based transitional housing program that provides supportive housing to single senior or disabled adults living with HIV for up to 18 months. All participants must engage in intensive case management and adhere to program guidelines.

Due to the time limited nature of the program, all participants must demonstrate and document productive activities throughout their time in the program. Productive activities are defined as activities that will support the participant's ability to secure stable housing by the completion of their enrollment in STOP.

STOP participants will be supported through a rental subsidy and will be required to pay 30% of their income toward rent. All participants must demonstrate the capacity to live independently, the ability to adhere to program guidelines, and commit activities that will result in future housing stability.

STOP PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- HIV+
- DC/Prince George's/Charles County Resident
- 58 years or older OR disabled
- Homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness
- Income must be at or below 50% of HUD's Area Median Income for Washington DC
- Must be able to commit to engaging in activities that will support future housing stability.
- Must demonstrate capacity to live independently.
- Must pass criminal background check.
- Must demonstrate at least 30 days of clean time.

TO APPLY:

- All applicants must complete a Metropolitan Housing Access Program Housing Referral Packet with a Housing Counseling Services' Case Manager.

- Applicants must be prepared to provide the following documentation:
 - Verification of HIV status: Labs detailing CD4 and viral load count from within 6 months AND a physician's statement confirming HIV status
 - Documentation of all household income within the last 90 days
 - Documentation of all household assets and financial resources
 - Verification of homelessness or imminent risk of homelessness
 - Verification of DC/PG/Charles County Residency
 - Government Issued Photo Identification (unexpired)
 - If a senior, verification of age
 - If disabled, verification of disability
 - Additional documents may be requested
